Westy-RISE Business Grant

Program Overview

The recent COVID-19 pandemic has created a state of economic emergency for Westminster's businesses. The City of Westminster is committed to our local economy and believes that we should take immediate action to help affected businesses mitigate these unprecedented challenges. Due to Public Health Order 20-22, effective March 17, 2020 and Public Health Order 20-24, effective March 26, 2020 (collectively, "Public Health Orders") many businesses that were not considered "Critical Businesses" were forced to temporarily close or dramatically limit operations. While nearly all businesses are facing economic losses, businesses that were ordered to close such as salons and gyms, as well as businesses that were forced to dramatically limit operations, such as restaurants restricted to carry-out only, are experiencing additional pressure and are in need of immediate assistance in order to satisfy rent and mortgage obligations. Our focus is on providing emergency assistance to help these businesses satisfy their short term rental and mortgage obligations and bridge the gap until other loans or funding sources can be secured.

Program Description

The City will commit \$1.5 million to the Westy-RISE Business Grant that may be used by qualifying businesses to satisfy monthly rental and mortgage payments. This one-time grant will equal the lesser of (i) 50% of each of the two months' rental or mortgage payments or (ii) \$7,500. The grant program may be applied to the first two monthly rent or mortgage payments due between March 17, 2020 and May 30, 2020. Monthly rental payments eligible for the grant include monthly base rent and any rent related expenses such as common area maintenance or reimbursements for insurance, utilities, and taxes. Monthly mortgage payments eligible for the grant include principal and interest.

Business Eligibility

To qualify for a grant, a business must meet all of the following criteria:

- 1. Business has been forced to temporarily close or forced to dramatically limit operations due to the Public Health Orders.
- 2. Business must have been in operation at least six months prior to the application date, with a physical address located within the City of Westminster.
- 3. Business must have an active Westminster business license.
- 4. Business applying for the grant must be a small business and may have no more than 50 FTEs. See application for guidelines on calculating FTEs.
- 5. Businesses with more than one physical location in the City of Westminster may apply for the grant program for one location only. For purposes of estimating FTEs, the FTE count shall be based only on the specific location applying for the grant. Corporately-owned national chains may not apply for the grant program.
- 6. Business must be in good standing with the City of Westminster as of March 1, 2020 and the Colorado Secretary of State. Considerations for good standing for the City of Westminster include outstanding taxes owed to the City of Westminster, outstanding utility bills, and all permits or licenses issued by the City of Westminster being current and active.

Program Process

- 1. Return a completed, signed, application to the City of Westminster Economic Development Department.
- 2. Provide support for the monthly rental or mortgage payment amount such as an executed lease agreement or mortgage coupon.
- 3. Final grant award decisions will be made by the Director of Economic Development based on criteria and eligibility detailed above.
- 4. Grants for eligible businesses will be awarded on a first-come, first serve basis, with priority given to businesses that generate local sales tax, subject to funding availability. However, since this grant program is intended to help the businesses most impacted by the Public Health Orders satisfy rental and mortgage obligations until other loans or funding sources can be secured, applications will only be accepted until May 30, 2020.
- 5. Grant awards will be paid directly to the applicant business. Checks will be mailed to the business address listed on the application.
